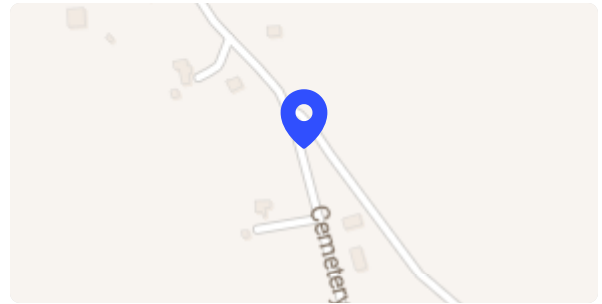

His engineering knowledge, design experience, research practice and engineering achievements made him fascinating leader of research and design teams. He was a remarkable person, talented engineer, exceptional structural mechanics specialist, outstanding educator, renowned academician, true humanist, an absolute gentleman and - a real Renaissance man. His departure is an immeasurable tremendous loss. Good bye Roman. When you left us, we lost a great human being. We will cherish the memories of you forever.
