George P. Nagy, 99, of Ashford, CT, passed away on Monday, February 22, 2021 in the comfort of his home. He was born in Ashford, son of the late Gustav and Gizella (Bashnak) Nagy. George worked as a tool grinder at Pratt & Whitney for over 30 years. He was a member of St. Philip the Apostle Church, where he sang in the choir for over 60 years. He was also a former Selectman and member of the Board of Finance for the Town of Ashford, but he was best known for cooking chicken for the Ashford Volunteer Fire Department barbeques. George is survived by his son, Gerald Nagy; two grandchildren, Carrie McCandlish and her husband Scott, and Katherine Timmons; three great grandchildren, Maia, Corrine and Liam, and several nieces and nephews. 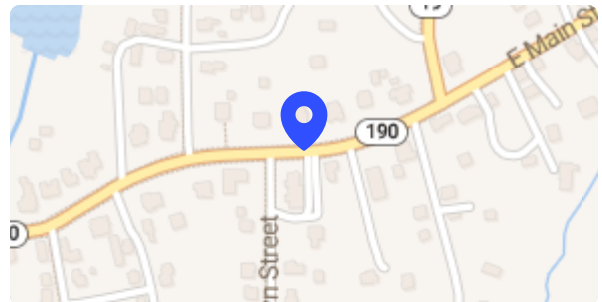

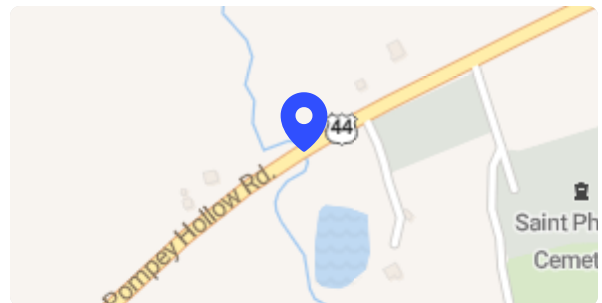
