**A**t age 98, Marjorie Kramer Dunn passed away peacefully on Tuesday, October 22, 2024 at The Pines of Bristol Center. The second of four daughters of the late William and Margaret (O'Brien) Kramer, she had wonderful family memories with her sisters growing up in Hartford and the neighborhood of West Morningside Street. Following her graduation in 1944 from Weaver High School, Marge began an early career in the insurance industry, which she resumed later in life. Upon her marriage in 1948, she moved to Bristol where she raised her family of four sons and lived until her passing.

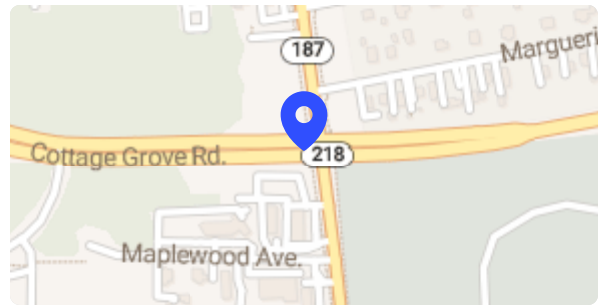

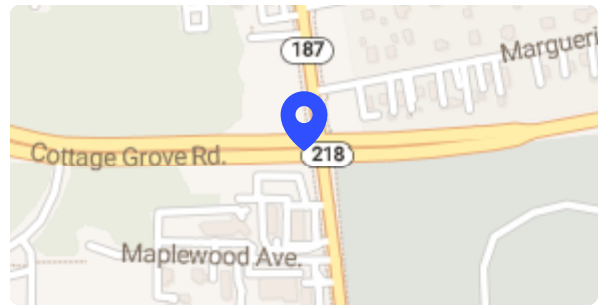
