Her amazing personality made for a perfect fit with her jobs in Human Resources. Jackie also loved to travel and explore new, out of the way places. Every trip included a stop at the local library and any independent bookstore that happened to be there. Even cancer was unable to keep her from travelling as she and Ed traveled right up to the end of last year.
